- ✦ *Spread the word: You can raise awareness of human trafficking by distributing copies of this brochure to anyone you think might come into contact with trafficking survivors.*
- ✦ *Educate yourself and others: The AATC conducts training sessions for social service providers and government agencies who may encounter trafficking victims. Contact us to arrange a training for your organization.*
- ✦ *Identify and refer trafficking victims: Trafficking survivors can obtain the services they need through the AATC. If you meet someone who may have been trafficked, call the Trafficking in Persons and Worker Exploitation Task Force, of the U.S. Department of Justice at 888-428-7581 (English only), your local services for trafficking survivors, or the AATC immediately.*

Human Trafficking: A Response

What is Human Trafficking?

Human trafficking is a series of steps in which a woman, man, or child is recruited at home and moved to a distant place through deception, fraud or violence, for the purpose of forced labor, slavery or servitude.

Trafficking survivors are forced into many different forms of labor, including domestic servitude, sweatshop and factory labor, farm work, restaurant work, and prostitution or other sex work.

Trafficking is a worldwide human rights crisis affecting almost every country, including the United States. Many trafficking victims are brought to the San Francisco Bay Area because of its large immigrant community.

What is the Asian Anti-Trafficking Collaborative?

The Asian Anti-Trafficking Collaborative (AATC) consists of four leading agencies preventing violence against Asian and Pacific Islander women in the San Francisco Bay Area.

AATC combats trafficking in three major ways. We:

1. Provide multi-lingual, culturally competent legal and social services to trafficking survivors through a client-centered, team based approach.
2. Support and strengthen other anti-trafficking programs by providing training and technical support.
3. Work to improve access to essential services including emergency housing and children's services for survivors of human trafficking.
